LICENSING ACT 2003

Following receipt of representations the Sub-Committee is required to consider the following application.

HARE AND HOUNDS, BRENTMOOR ROAD, WEST END

Type: Premises Licence - Application for a Conversion/Variation

1. Description of Premises:

(as detailed by the applicant in the application form)

Traditional public house selling alcoholic and non alcoholic drink and food, providing musical entertainment on a very occasional basis under the '2 in a bar' rule with an outside drinking area (including a beer garden) adjoining the premises and staff accomodation.

2. Licensable Activities Currently Permitted:

Consumption of Alcohol On Premises
Consumption of Alcohol Off Premises
Provision Of Late Night Refreshment

3. Time Limits on Current Licence(s):

Late night refreshment until the end of drinking up time.

4. Conditions Subject To Which Existing Licence Has Been Granted

(as detailed by the applicant in the application form)

The premises has the benefit of a childrens' certificate which is in turn subject to standard conditions and a terminal hour of 21.00 hours.

5. Variation Sought:

(as detailed by the applicant in the application form)

To vary the hours permitted for the sale of alcohol to 07.00 until 02.30 hours the following day. To add other licensable activities including regulated entertainment and late night refreshment until 03.00. To allow children limited access to the premises.

6. Terms or Restrictions to be Removed

(as detailed by the applicant in the application form)

The removal of embedded conditions relating to permitted hours, licensable activities and children.

7. Promotion of Licensing Objectives
(as detailed by the applicant in the application form)

General

No general conditions are proposed, other than the mandatory conditions in the Licensing Act 2003, on the basis that there is no reason to believe that the proposed variation will give rise to any general problem.

The Prevention of Crime and Disorder

To maintain a CCTV system as recommended by and agreed with the Police.

Public Safety

There are no public safety issues associated with the premises or the proposed variation and no additional conditions are proposed.

The Prevention of Public Nuisance

There are no public nuisance issues associated with the premises and no additional conditions are proposed. The use of outside areas for the consumption of alcohol will be limited to 23.00.

The Protection of Children From Harm

Children under the age of 14 will not be permitted to remain in the premises after 23.00 hours save that on New Years Eve, children will be permitted to remain in the premises until 01.00 hours on 1st January. If any film is shown that has not been previously broadcast before 20.00 hours on television, it will be subject to an appropriate age classification and children under the appropriate age will not be permitted in the premises when the film is shown.

8. Relevant Representations

Representations have been received from Environmental Services and nine other interested parties. Copies of these representations are attached at Annex C and D respectively. These representations are relevant to the prevention of public nuisance, prevention of crime and disorder, protection of children from harm and public safety licensing objectives.

9. Policy Considerations

Paragraphs 18 - 48, 54 - 64, 72 - 78, 79 - 96 of the Council's Licensing Policy Statement are applicable to the consideration of this application. These paragraphs are set out in Annexes A.
