STATEMENT OF COMMUNITY INVOLVEMENT ADOPTION STATEMENT
Planning and Compulsory Purchase Act 2004
Town & Country Planning (Local Development)(England) Regulations 2004

On 21st February 2006 the Surrey Heath Borough Council formally adopted its Statement of Community Involvement (SCI). In doing so it has met the requirements of the above regulations.

The SCI sets out how the Borough Council will involve the community in the preparation of its Local Development Framework and in determining significant planning applications.

Any person who feels aggrieved by the decision of the Borough Council to adopt the SCI may apply to the High Court for permission to apply for a judicial review of the decision to adopt the statement. Any challenge must be made on the grounds that either the document has not been prepared within the powers conferred by Part 2 of the Planning and Compulsory Purchase Act 2004 or alternatively that a requirement of the Act or association Regulations has not been complied with.

Any such application must be made no later than 3 months after the date of adoption specified above.
