A plan indeed. Very comprehensive and helps with the sleep disciplines...

Thoughts and comments:

Whilst the housing plans are well understood and considered, the maximum density of housing perhaps needs to be specified. Having studied plans on some of the builds around the sites / houses concerned; they have it seems little 'gardening space' but lots of parking (at least two car spaces per house). How does this fit with the plan to provide a green environment, when from experience small gardens will lead to gravelling or concreting (all types).

It is noted that the plans for building on the old water works at Frimley Green do not seem to be included in the overall presentation document? The map of FG indicates its presence but! Land off Spencer Close provided, could a railway halt be provided at that location? In respect of Frimley Green and access to public transport, the railway track adjacent to the Old Water works could also make an ideal stopping place for passengers to Frimley Green to join the train to Camberley / Ash Vale; given there appears to be provision for 100 plus homes on that site? This would reduce the car traffic onto the Sturt Road with perhaps a parking income regularly at the FG Lodge for foot passengers.

Having heard of multiple concerns regarding the Camberley Stink, the requirement for the developers / builders merely to be 'encouraged' to work with Thames Water seems not to be serious enough. Each and every additional home will produce an additional quantity of waste water / sewage to be managed. Planning for enlarged / added capacity treatment plant and if identified, enlarged sewage pipes needs to be documented (ultimately costs will fall on the home buyers / owners and disruption on current community). Does this cost need highlighting and how will it be paid?

Charging points for car batteries perhaps does not it seems fully appreciate the need for greater power / cabling supplies. Recently the Mindenhurst site had to dig and lay electrical cables to the Sub station in Farnborough (approx 6000m). Has this additional need plus disruption caused by digging up active roads been considered? Ditto gas supplies?


Allied to the sewage waste is the water supply to each property, meeting current legal and ethical standards, sourcing the water could / should identify the possibility of private water supplies and necessary treatment as applicable.

Whilst the possibility / provision of Allotments at Mindenhurst is documented elsewhere, nowhere in the document is there reference to additional allotment space, given that the plans indicate an increase in population across the borough, this should be part of the environmental plan and greening policy perhaps? Waiting lists for current allotment spaces are available (C&DHS).

If I have mis read or not fully appreciated what was written on the document reviewed, please accept my apologise. It was a lot of words with initials which required a check at the back of the book. JSP101 applies.
