Two special displays on the artistic association of the area:

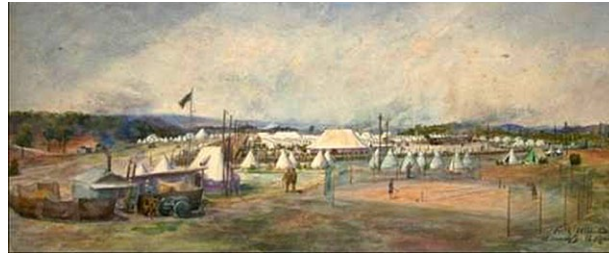
'The War of the Worlds' – H.G. Wells

Frith Hill Trench Walk

Frith Hill Road, Frimley, Surrey GU16 6GB

Frith Hill near Frimley has had many military camps and practice areas during both World Wars. The area was a practice area for trench warfare and the site of a German Prisoner of War camp during the First World War. Led by local military expert, Roy Sellstrom BEM, the walk reveals the earth movements and visual signs that reveal the use of the area during the war years and the stories and facts from the past.

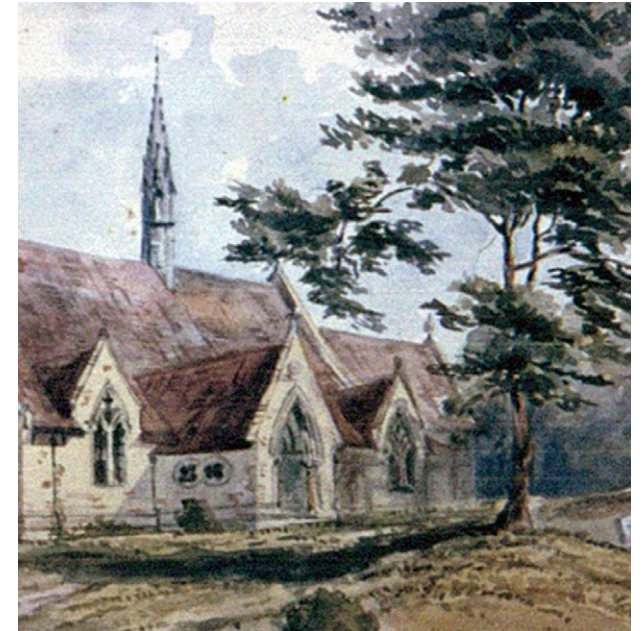

Afternoon Recital with Military Theme

St. Michael's Church, 286 London Road, Camberley, Surrey GU15 3JP

St. Michael's Church in Camberley was built for the growing military community of York Town in 1851; it has had a strong presence in the community ever since.

To celebrate the military links Surrey Heath Museum and the church are staging a special afternoon concert with Composer and Pianist Andy Quin, playing pieces with a military association and David Andrews, who recreates military trumpets and plays the military pipe anthems from the 1700s and 1800s.
